ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

Our Club has been a strong supporter of The Foundation over many, many years. This year has been no exception. In summary we have satisfied our District 9800 commitments, supported The Polio Plus Campaign, supported The District 9800 Water Project in the Philippines, encouraged our Club members to consider personal contributions to The Foundation and mounted a major project in Uganda. The following provides a little more flesh to our activities.

District 9800 Contributions

Your Club contributed \$3250 to District in satisfaction of the challenge that each Club should provide \$110US per Member. This was part of our Club's targets for the year.

The Polio Plus Program

Your Club met its commitment to this program by contributing \$1000 to this long standing activity to eradicate the pernicious disease of Polio from the entire world. Only small pockets of the disease remain.

District 9800 Water Project in the Philippines

Your Club contributed \$500 to a significant fresh collection and distribution system in the Philippines.

Personal Contribution To The Foundation

There are 3 of our members who are currently Centurions who contribute \$150 per year to The Foundation. In addition I appealed for other Members to consider personal donations. A number of Members were given the appropriate form on which they consider such a step. Additional forms are available for those who may be interested.

Joint Project with the Rotary Club of Altona City Inc.

Barbara Nanteza has been a welcome addition to our Club over the last 18 months. She is a Ugandan national and a member of The Rotary Club of Sunrise Kampala which is a part of District 9200. That district and our District 9800 are part of an International Rotary Foundation experimental program known as "Future Vision".

With Barbara's assistance together with The Rotary Club of Altona City Inc a we have initiated a fresh water supply project in a village 25kms from Kampala the capital of Uganda. Total cost will be \$64000US.

The project involves a deep water bore, repair to an existing bore and harvesting facilities at homes all aimed at providing fresh water in the interests of supply and disease prevention.

Financing will involve a \$5000US contribution from our Club, an equivalent amount from Altona City and another \$8300US from other Rotary Clubs in District 9800. The remainder will be covered by The foundation.
